Only new commercial HVAC packaged DX cooled systems and air-source heat pumps installed between **January 1, 2019** and **December 31, 2019** that meet the Premium Efficiency Cooling Program (“Program”) requirements are eligible for rebates.

Important Information for Customers/Contractors:

- All installations must be performed by a C-20 licensed contractor as required in the State of California and must have all licenses as required by Federal, California and local laws, rules and regulations, and are qualified to perform HVAC installations.
- Post-installation verification is required for all projects.
- Permits are required per local regulations: *(Some exceptions apply)*
Senate Bill 454: Effective January 1, 2013, SB 454 requires utility companies to collect a permit number and contractor signature (if applicable) for HVAC rebate related measures. This applies to equipment installation or replacement work requiring permits under local codes.

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Senate Bill 1414: Effective January 1, 2017, SB 1414 in accordance with California Public Utilities Code section 399.4(b), the customer (or their contractor) must provide SDG&E proof of permit closure before any rebate or incentive for the purchase or installation of central air-conditioning, heat pumps, or related fans can be paid by SDG&E.

4. Customers must reserve funds prior to installation and notify contractors at time of bid that they intend to file for program incentives.
5. Reservations do not guarantee funding or approval of final equipment selection. Customers must provide reasonable access to program inspectors and/or measurement and evaluation contractors for verification of equipment installation. Incentive levels and eligibility criteria are subject to change without advanced notice.
